

NOTICE OF PROPOSAL
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984
LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(VARIOUS ROADS, ROSSENDALE BOROUGH) (REVOCATION OF RESTRICTED ROADS)
ORDER 202*

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lancashire County Council propose to make the above Speed Limit Order under Sections 82(2) and 83(2) of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the **Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984**, as amended, the effect of which will be to revoke the following:

- a) Schedule 2 of the "Lancashire County Council (Blackburn Road, Burnley Road And Bury Road, Rossendale Borough) (Revocation And 30 Mph, 40 Mph And 50 Mph Speed Limit) Order 2012";
- b) The "Lancashire County Council (Bocholt Way, Rawtenstall And Blackburn Road, Haslingden, Rossendale Borough) (Revocation And Restricted Roads) Order 2012" in full;
- c) The "Lancashire County Council (Broadway, Haslingden, Rossendale Borough) (Revocation, Part Revocation And Restricted Road) Order 2013" in full.

Where no further speed limit is re-introduced, the speed limit will revert to restricted road status by virtue of street lighting, where a 30mph speed limit will apply.
